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Design brief

Introduction

Samcheock city is in the administrative district of Gangwon Providence and it is a nodal area of tourism for the East coast of Korea. Historically, Yisabu, a general/administrator of Silla(one of the nations of 'Three Kingdoms Period' in the Korean Peninsula), launched in 512 A.D. his voyage to Usanguk (an island nation in East Coast of Korean Peninsula, now Ulleungdo and Dokdo).It is one of the important evidences showing that Dokdo is the territory of the Republic of Korea.

As a result, Samcheok city established a project to enhance Yisabu and exalted Yisabu as a representative figure of Samcheok city. Moreover, it has been promoting various projects to promote historical and cultural significance of incorporating Usanguk. In the meantime, it has been consistently suggested that information related to Yisabu should be conveyed through the creative and specialized space so that people can experience its symbolic meaning.



This is the background of <Yisabu Dokdo Memorial

Park International Competition>. Specifically, it is planned to create a monumental place for Yisabu and Dokdo in the vicinity of Jungrajin Mt. Yukhyang and Obon Port, which are known to be related to the port of departure to Usanguk. Participants of the competition should plan a memorial space that integrates history and culture by utilizing the tangible and intangible assets of the Yisabu's incorporating Usanguk and the planning should include programs such as education, publicity, experience, and play/leisure regarding to Dokdo, as well as spatial plans that can respond to various arts and cultures.

Competition Type

This competition is an open project competition for domestic and international professionals.

This competition was approved by the International Union of Architects (UIA) and follows the UIA-UNESCO regulation and the UIA guide.

Eligibility Criteria

- This competition is open to Korean and international professionals in architecture, urban planning / landscape, exhibition / interior design.
- There is no restriction on the number of team members, Professional team members can only participate in one team. Each team can enter one project.
- At the time of registration, one representative of the participants must be a domestic or foreign architect. In this case, the architect must maintain the qualification of the architect in accordance with the law of the relevant country at the time of registration and be able to prove it in writing or documents. The leader of the team must be an architect.
- The judges, the management committee members, the technical committee members
 of the competition, or the employees of those organizations cannot participate.

Official Language

The official language of the competition is Korean and English, and all submissions should be written in English. In discordance with the translation in the competition brief and materials given to participants of the competition, the English version takes precedence over the Korean one.

Scope of Work

- The scope of work follows the job directives stipulated in the competition brief of the Yisabu Dokdo Memorial Park.
- The scope of work related to the design of this project is inclusive of schematic design, design development, construction design.
- The cost of the whole process to receive various authorization, certifications, and permits required for the performance of the project is included in the design fee.
- According to contents of the 1st prize winning work, the project can proceed with the corporation with marketing and tourism experts.

Design Contract

General Information

The design contract shall be in accordance with the relevant laws and regulations of the Republic of Korea. The design contract shall be concluded with the author of the first prize work, but if the winner does not have a representative from an architectural office in Korea, it shall be concluded jointly with the representative of the architectural office in Korea selected by the winner. This is in order to comply with Korean building codes and carry out the building permit process smoothly.

Design qualification supplement

If the 1st prize winner does not meet the qualification requirements for design such as civil engineering, landscape, electricity, communication, fire safety, surveying, geological survey, etc., he / she should provide under his/her contract with the client all the necessary subcontractors in order to cover all competences to get building permits and design implementation as per the legal conditions in Korea.

Design modification, supplementation, change

The 1st prize winner shall synthesize comments of the jurors and requirements of the client. If needed, the winner shall incorporate them into design by revising/supplementing design.

In addition, if the design plan needs to be revised due to changes in the priority plans (urban masterplan and urban management planning, various impact assessments, building deliberations and permits, energy efficiency grade 1, green building certification, etc.), then winner should correct and supplement the project to reflect the changes. Additional design fee for above cases would not be paid.

In addition to the priority plans listed above, the 1st prize winner must reflect in the design the modifications resulting from the decisions of the City and the Cultural Property Commission after excavation survey of the site that will be executed after the competition.

Copyright

- The authors of the entries possess the intellectual property rights to the submitted projects.
- Entrants must ensure that the submitted work does not infringe the exclusive rights of intellectual property of third parties. (If a third party's intellectual property rights are used, a written document certifying the right to use such third party's written consent should be attached),
- In the event a winner has objections to the intellectual property rights stated above, the
 winner shall, in principle, settle in consultation with the client. If the dispute cannot be
 resolved, the winner may apply to the Intellectual Property Rights Commission of Korea for
 arbitration.

Publication Rights

- The client and the UIA have the right to publish the entries with proper attribution credited to the author's name.
- The competition organizer and the UIA have the right to publish the entries and proposals as they are or excerpts with proper attribution to the author.

Return of Work

All submissions will be destroyed after publication unless otherwise noted.

Program

Program Description

(1) Site

Site Area 24,614 m²


Local Districts: Natural green area, Degree 1 residential area, Degree 2 residential area, general commercial area, cultural heritage protection zone.

- Estimated construction cost: KRW 20,800,000,000(including VAT) *(USD 1,112,271.54)
- Estimated design fee: KRW 1,278,000,000(including VAT)* *(USD 1,112,271.54) (USD 1 = KRW 1,149.30)
- * Prize money may vary depending on the exchange rate on the payment date.
- The site consists of about 109 parcels (about 24,614 square meters) in addition to 82-1 Jengsan-dong at the center of Mt. Yukhyang, and it is located about 2 km southeast of the intersection of Jungang-ro (road) in Samcheok city
- It is adjacent to Samcheok Port, and has a mining and shipping factory site on the east and south of the site.
- There are old residential facilities in the west and north. The apartment complex on the site and the factory site in the east and south were constructed through reclamation projects in the estuary of Ohsipcheon.(Ohsip Stream)
- Among the existing buildings, there are important ones including the Jungra-dong Fire station, Jungra-dong Community center, and the Misoo temple. These are considered to be worth preserving or conserving.
- Jungra-dong Fire station should be considered as a priority for conservation thanks to the significance and aesthetic value of its architecture associated with the local area.
- The Jungra-dong Community Center, which is in good condition, can be similarly reused by remodeling.
- Misoo temple hosts sacrificial rites. It is necessary to plan spatial space in connection with the cultural assets on the site (Monuments Chukju-Donghaebi and Daehan Pyungsootochanbi).

(2) Basic Direction

- The plan should faithfully fulfill its role as the center of education, experience, and tourism for Samcheok city's history, culture, and Dokdo. The memorial park should be carefully planned so as to serve these functions.
- Notably, it should include a plan to highlight the historical significance of the memorial park through enjoyable experiences for children and students, and the plan should entice tourists and visitors to return.
- The planning of the architectural and individual spaces reflects the basic concepts and themes, but it is possible for the participants to make changes within the scope of the guidelines while still maintaining the original purpose and required areas of the planning facilities. It is not necessary to design them as independent separate buildings or spaces. Open for creative proposals.
- The historical ruins located on the site are Jindongru (east watch gate of old fortress) and Samcheokpojin (old fortress wall), which were part of the defense bases of the East Coast. These can be symbolically reinterpreted.

• The proposal should suggest alternatives that can be closely linked to the space around the competition venue. Upcoming projects in the surrounding area include plans to extend pedestrian linkages and a vehicle road to Osipcheon(Osip Stream) and Obun Port, the departure port for Yisabu, and urban regeneration projects for nearby tourist attractions such as Samcheok Port and Naritgol Village, Deserted Factory and Shipyard Site. Data on the site can be downloaded from the website.





(3) Code Review

See the Appendix for a detailed description.

(4) Site Condition

- Most of the site is flat with 2 ~ 3m rise above sea level, Mt. Yukhyang is at the center of the site with a peak at 25m above sea level.
- According to the urban plan, 3m wide and 4m wide roads within the site will be expanded to 6m and 12m respectively.
- A new 8-meter wide road to the east of the site will be constructed.
- According to the plan for this project, the road on the site can be changed in the urban planning. The roads on the sites could be re-routed or closed depending on design intent.
- The buildings near the site are usually one or two story low-rise buildings that do not greatly affect the view.
- The solar radiation conditions of the site are generally good. Mt. Yukhyang is not high and the slopes are gentle. The north face of Mt. Yukhyang have enough sunlights even in winter.
- The natural green area of the site is concentrated on about 24.70% of the total planned area.
- The apartment building in the east of site will be demolished.
- The entire site is protected as a cultural heritage protection zones area and is subject to restrictions on construction and height and the topographic levels of Mt. Yukhyang must be kept.

(5) Planning facility

Planning facility

- Tourists must enter the area by car or on foot, and visit the tourist information center first.
- The tourist information center should provide tourist information for Samcheok city and consider the convenience of tourist families including a childcare center.
- The Yisabu Memorial hall allows the story of the general to be experienced visually and spatially
- The Dokdo Experience Space should be able to provide information, experience, play and academic research, which are related to the history of Dokdo.
- Cultural arts and residential villages should be given two priorities: 1) supporting residence
 and lodging for local people and artists and 2) supporting spaces for them to carry out their
 creative activities.
- The park should organically link each facility and space and enable various activities

Planning of facility layout

- Jungra Fire Station, Misoo Temple, and Jungradong Community Center are subject to preservation and conservation plans
- The 3m wide road in the residence area which is presumed to be the old waterway and the 10m wide road on the planned side of the Yisabu Memorial hall are exempt from the widening plan according to the urban planning decision.
- Mt. Yukhyang is to be included in the overall layout plan in keeping with the current topographic level.
- The parking lot should be efficiently arranged at the entrance of the site (north and south) and carefully consider traffic flow of tourists who are visiting Samcheok port and surroundings.
- Urban planning will be revised according to the plans incorporated in the winning project.
 Therefore, the entry is not required to keep the site coverage ratio (BCR) and floor area ratio*(FAR) indicated in the Korean building regulations.

Tourist Information Center

• Introduction

It is the convenient starting point where sightseers and tourists visiting Samcheok city can obtain transportation and tourist information.

Visitors can get general information about Samcheok city through the information center and can use the tourism resources efficiently through the provided tourism support program. By providing various convenient services, it also functions as a support facility for the Yisabu Dokdo Memorial Park.

The representative space of the Yisabu Dokdo Memorial Park and the core area where the history of General Yisabu is explained.

Dokdo Experience Space

Summary

A space for diverse activities such as historical education, conferences and performances on the subject of the territorial defense of the Republic of Korea, as it relates to Dokdo.

Culture and Art Village

Summary

The Culture and Art Village is required to be planned within the existing old residential area of the site. This area was formed in the Japanese colonial period by the people who worked at nearby shipyards. Currently about 30 people of 20 families are living and most of them are composed of the elderly households with a low level income. Rather than evicting them, a desirable solution might be suggested by presenting spaces that can be linked to the main facilities of the Yisabu Memorial Park.

Considering the present state of each buildings in the area, participants can freely select buildings to be renovated and provide facilities such as spaces for artists(living, working, displaying and selling their works) or small-scale guesthouses for visitors also might be a good answer. The proposal for this area is up to participants' design intent which is to be shown in the site plan, aerial view and interior/exterior perspective views.

Park

Summary

The park organically links planned facilities and spaces within the site. It can be used as a resting space and a green space. Mt. Yukhyang should be included in conjunction with the overall site plan. Historical remains such as Samcheokpojin wall, and Jindongru can be selectively reconstructed or symbolically reinterpreted. It can also be actively considered as an art park where the story of General Yisabu can be expressed symbolically.





Appendix

Historical environment

Name: Yisabu

General Yisabu succeeded in incorporating the Usanguk (currently Ulleungdo and Dokdo) and the Daegaya, and in the time of King Jinheung (period of reign: 540-576), he took control over central politics and military power as a commander of army.

Annual events in Samcheok City for General Yisabu

 Regular events, the Yisabu history and Culture Festival (Yisabu Dokdo Festival), the Restoration Project for Yisabu Route Exploration and the Dokdo Academy, etc, held to celebrate the accomplishments of Yisabu.



Yisabu Lion Park

As a Family theme park, there are outdoor theaters, observatory decks, exhibition halls, sleds, etc., and the wooden lion statues submitted to the festival are exhibited in the park



Yisabu voyage Monument

It is a 6m high monument and is located near Obun port, which is supposed to be the starting point for Yisabu's incorporation of Usanguk.

Promote General Yisabu's sprit to protect Dokdo.

- The Yisabu History and Culture Festival (Yisabu Dokdo Festival) is an annual event held to strengthen the willingness to protect Dokdo, market the brand of General Yisabu, and promote tourism. The festival includes the Yisabu worship ceremony and the opening ceremony, the Dokdo Yisabu Conference, battleship racing competitions, etc.
- Samcheok city has restored the route linking Samcheok Ulleungdo Dokdo Ulleungdo Samcheok to enhance the public awareness of Dokdo and Ulleungdo and contribute to the

spread of maritime culture.

- The Dokdo Academy, hosted by the Ministry of Education, the Northeast Asian History Foundation and the Korean Association of Yisabu, has carried out a variety of events including historical and academic investigation on the Samcheok outport, exhibitions, writing contests, Gwageo (name of exams to elect government officials in the past) contests for students, and the visitors' area exposed to a variety of experiential activities in order to raise the historical awareness of Yisabu and Dokdo.
- The academic symposium on construction of the Dokdo Experience Center, hosted by Samcheok city, the Korean Association of Yisabu and the Silla Historical Society, has contributed to the establishment of the "Yisabu Dokdo Experience Hall" project, which provides opportunities for field experiences in Dokdo, the East Sea and the national territorial sovereignty.

Geographical environment

Conditions of surrounding context




- The site is located 2km away from the center of Samcheok city to Southeast and the intersection between Osipcheon(Osip stream) and the East sea is adjacent to it.
- The site is flat except for the 25 m high Mt. Yukhyang and there is Mt. Bonghwang next to it. Mt. Goseong(99.2m) is located across the Osipcheon(Osip stream) and there is Obun Port, which is known as the port of the beginning of Yisabu's incorporation of Usanguk.
- To the west of the site is the National Highway No. 7, which can be used to reach Donghae and Uljin, and the Saecheonnyeon-doro (New Millennium Road), which was developed as a tourism resource on the east coast to the northeast. Samcheok Port was renamed from Jungra Port in 1980, and following the recent decline of fishing, it functions primarily as a trade port. The Samcheok bus terminal is 1.5km away by straight line and the city bus takes about 15 minutes. In the Samcheok Station, the Donghae sightseeing train visits

- Jeongdongjin twice a week (three times on weekends).
- Through the site runs part of the Haeparang road between Samcheok city and Donghae is formed along Osipcheon(Osip stream). The starting point of the eastern mountain trail is near to the site. Within one (1) km of the site, there is Yisabu Plaza, Yisabu voyage monument, Naritgol, Samcheok Rose Park, the Mausoleum for dynasty Silla's family, etc. Within 2.5km, Samcheok's major cultural assets and tourist attractions are clustered, including the Jukseoru(pavilion), Municipal Museum, the World Cave Expo Complex and the Culture and Art Center.

History around the site

- · Samcheok Port is assumed to be a defense center for the Silla Dynasty.
- In 1520, Samcheokpojin wall as a part of the defense bases of the East Coast was constructed centering on Jindongru (East Gate) and Jukgotdo (Mt. Yukhyang) and served as a regional military port until 1898 when the military camp was closed. Jindongru (East Gate) can be symbolically reinterpreted.
- Currently, Samcheok Port acts as an international trade port following the decline of fisheries.
- Jindongru (East Gate) can be symbolically reinterpreted.




Tourist attractions nearby

- Among the tourist attractions near the site, Naritgol village is developing tourism resources by renovating existing houses and installing an observation space for the creation of a village with pictures and stories with expected completion in 2017.
- Traditional tourist attractions include museums, exhibition halls and art centers in the area of Jukseoru (pavilion). Five (5) km to the north of the site lies the East Sea Observatory and the Yisabu Lion Park, a family theme park with sleds for four seasons.
- In addition, there are the recreational areas of Lady Suro Park, Sol beach Samcheok and Samcheok Rose Park.



View



- Surrounding buildings which are 1-2 stories tall do not affect the views greatly.
- The factory (Sekwang Mtech) adjacent to the site situated to the east is higher than Mt. Yukhyang (25m), which blocks the view of the East Sea from the site.

Daylight

- Overall daylight exposure of the site is sufficient.
- The north side of Mt. Yukhyang is low and sloped gently so that it has a good daylight exposure.
- West part of the site where the residential houses are dense shows a good daylight exposure through the year.
- However, east part of the site only receives direct daylight after 10 am in winter solstice due to air pollution from the adjacent factories.

Green space

• The green space within the site is concentrated on 9 parcels of the natural green area including 85 Jeongsang-dong. This corresponds to about 24.70% of the total site area.

Trees and vegetation

- Cherry trees are planted along the 7th National Road and Saecheonnyeon-doro (New Millennium road).
- Juniper, fir, pine tree and bamboo, etc. are planted on Mt. Yukhyang




2. Certain regards of Cultural heritage protection zone

- The entire site is under cultural heritage protection. There are restrictions according to the each zone refer to the diagram below.
- The red zone in diagram below is cultural heritage protection zone with restriction of no construction activity. The Green zone is subject to the decision of cultural heritage committee.
- The building height in the yellow zone should be less than 5 m (8m, pitched roof) and in the blue zone the building height should be less than 11m(15m, pitched roof)..
