NOTES ON GARDENS BY THE BAY DESIGN WORKSHOP

Facilitated by Tay Kheng Soon

- 1. It is proposed to have a public workshop on ideas and designs for the Gardens by the Bay on 24th, 25th and 26th March for all those interested to make a contribution of their ideas and concepts to this important project.
- 2. The venue for the workshop will be at the Singapore Institute of Architects premises at Neil Road.
- 3. Many students, landscape designers, nature people, heritage people and architects have indicated interest to participate in this workshop.
- 4. Invitations will also be extended to Nparks, STB, URA and NHB to attend and to participate. The press will also be invited.
- 5. A website will be established to communicate the ideas and to receive feedback from the general public. All participants will be acknowledged in the website.
- 6. The entire workshop will be recorded on video.
- 7. At the end of the workshop, there will be a public presentation of the ideas, design drawings and models.
- 8. Tentatively, Friday morning will be devoted to intellectual mind stretching. There will be talks on the history of gardens in Singapore, botany, nature conservation, heritage and the city, post-colonial development. These presentations will be followed by discussions.
- 9. Friday afternoon will be devoted to discussion of ideas.
- 10. Saturday will then be devoted to graphical explorations of the ideas through round table design sessions. More than one scheme is anticipated.
- 11. Sunday should be devoted to presentation model making.
- 12. Monday morning would be a public presentation and press conference at the SIA premises.
