PROFILE



William Alsop

Born in 1947, William Alsop studied at the Architectural Association in the 1960s and worked with practices including those of Maxwell Fry, Cedric Price and Roderick Ham before joining forces with John Lyall in 1981 and forming a new practice with Jan Stomer in 1991. Alsop's best known buildings include the Peckham Library and Media Centre, which won the coveted Stirling Prize

in 2000; the Hotel du Département des Bouches-du-Rhône in Marseille, France; and The Sharpe Centre for Design at the Ontario School of Art and Design, Canada.



Steven Holl

Steven Holl was born in 1947 in Bremerton, Washington. He graduated from the University of Washington and pursued architecture studies in Rome in 1970. In 1976 he joined the Architectural Association in London and established STEVEN HOLL

ARCHITECTS in New York City. Considered one of America's most important architects, Steven Holl is recognized for his ability to blend space and light with great contextual sensitivity and to utilize the unique qualities of each project to create a concept-driven design. He specializes in seamlessly integrating new projects into contexts with particular cultural and historic importance.



Rafael Vinoly

In Rafael Vinoly's nearly forty years of practice in the United States, Latin America, East Asia and Europe, his work has always been driven by the belief that the essential responsibility of architecture is to elevate the public realm. As in his much-publicized proposal for the World Trade Centre site, his deepest focus has been on maximizing the opportunity for civic investment generated by every construction project.

Vinoly's work is marked by a sustained structural originality, which transcends the passing fads of architectural movements. At home with both large and small-scale projects, his recent work ranges from university buildings such as the Chicago University Graduate School of Business and the Watson Institute for International Studies at Brown University to leading edge biomedical and nanosystems research facilities such as the Howard Hughes Medical Institute, the National Institutes of Health, and the University of California, Los Angeles. His work also encompasses courthouses, private residence, athletic facilities and performing art venues such as the new home for Jazz at Lincoln Centre in New York City and the Leicester City Theatre and Performing Arts Centre in the United Kingdom. Among Vinoly's museum projects are the Cleveland Museum of Art, the Tampo Museum of Art, the Nasher Museum at Duke University, and the Brooklyn Children's Museum.

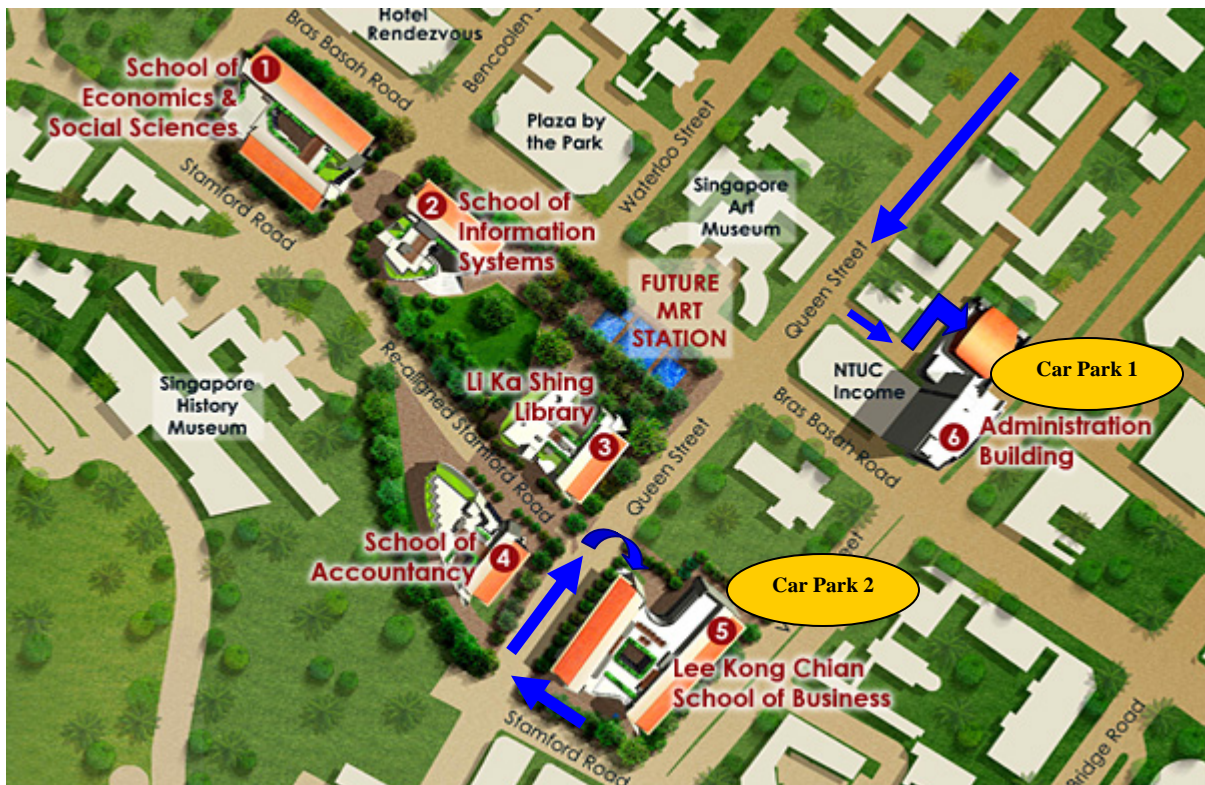
