SYNOPSIS

Cities of the world are changing in their response to climate and land availability. The discussion will focus on new cities and approaches within the Emirates on sea, cities in China and new urbanism in Malaysia.

The discussion will also focus on the exploration of some recent urban design issues within Singapore itself compared with similar projects within Australia and other global examples.

Some new work will be discussed that is relevant to projects within Singapore, such as the sports hub. And the issues of architecture and structure as an integrated process.

The discussion will also address future directions of architecture as seen from a medium sized company and globalisation versus regionalism and nationalism.

PROFILE

Prof Philip Cox, RAIA Gold Medal & Prize Recipient

Prof Philip Cox is a Director of Cox Architects & Planners. Some prominent projects which he was responsible for include Sydney Football Stadium, Sydney Olympics Superdome, Sydney Olympics Aquatic Centre, Observatory Hotel in Sydney, Kuala Lumpur Civic Central and Exhibition and Convention Centre, and Dubai Festival City.

Prof Philip Cox has received numerous awards in recognition of his contribution to architecture, including RAIA Gold Medal in 1984, Life Fellowship to the RAIA in 1987 and Honourable Fellowship of the American Institute of Architects in the same year. In 1988, he was awarded the Order of Australia for services to architecture. In 1993, he received the Inaugural award for Sport and Architecture from the International Olympic Committee and was elected a Fellow of the Royal College of Humanities. Other awards and citations include the Commonwealth Association of Architects - Sir Robert Matthew Award for innovative architecture, Royal Australian Institute of Architects Prize, 2004 Australian Export Heroes Awards.
