SYNOPSIS

Revised Clauses In Fire Code 2007

Fire Code 2007 was effective since 30 June 2007. This 6th edition of the fire code revision has less drastic changes as compared to the last revision in 2002. In this seminar we will not just touch on the changes of various clauses, as it has already been highlighted during recent FSSD seminars. This seminar will instead emphasis on some important revised clauses, and discuss comprehensively to ensure everyone has a better understanding of the clauses.

Security Planning For The Built Environment

Security planning for the built environment against urban terrorism such as car and suicide bombers suggests a re-thinking is necessary for the way we plan our neighborhoods, layout the urban spaces, design our buildings, and the way we organized the various functions within the buildings. Awareness; and mitigation measures that can be incorporated in various stages of project planning will be discussed.

Case Studies of Recent Fire Incidents and Key Lessons

This presentation will focus on case studies involving major fire occurrences in Singapore in recent years. It will aim to share the circumstances of the cases and highlight key learning points of relevance to building and fire safety professionals in the prevention and management of fires.

To assist Architects and Building Professionals in better understanding of the important revised clauses in Fire Code 2007, to understand the impacts of security planning on building designs, and to learn from case studies of major fires.

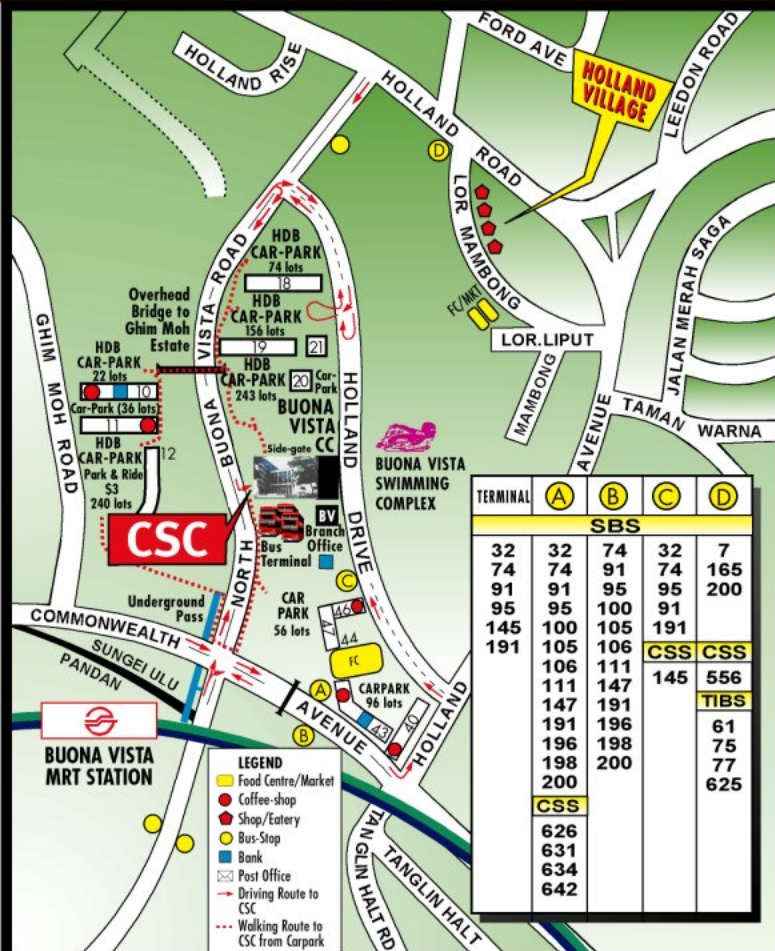
