Architect as 'Designer' under WSH Council 'Guidelines for Designing for Safety in Buildings & Structures'

The Workplace Safety and Health Act 2007 have been in force since 2007. The current emphasis is on site safety. From this year, the focus will be on the design and planning as it is an essential component in every construction work. "Reducing risk at source" is one of the components to improve site safety. How does it impact on architects/designers? How can we benefit from this? The committee considers this as an opportunity for our professionals rather than a burden. Attend this seminar to find out why we say that! You may find a new lease of life in your practice!

Architect as 'Designer' under WSH Council 'Guidelines on Design for Safety in Buildings & Structures' - The Equivalent Schemes in Other Countries'

The presentation will contrast the WSH Council's "Guidelines on Design for Safety in Buildings and Structures" with similar guidelines and legislation in other jurisdictions, most notably, in the UK and Australia. An appreciation of the precedents set in other countries may help in the development of a deeper understanding of the implications and future directions of Singapore's WSH Guidelines.

Architect as 'Designer' for Safety & Health - Case Law

The speaker shall introduce the recently enacted Workplace Safety and Health Act (Chapter 354A, revised edition 2007(herein known as "WSH Act") and the subsidiary legislations. Salient features of the WSH Act and the legislations would be highlighted to see how they may affect architects in the course of work. Examples of past case laws would be cited to show how the First Instance Courts and Court of Appeal, UK, interpret an act similar (enacted in 1974) to the WSH Act.

Architect as 'Project Safety & Health Coordinator'

For this topic, the speaker will introduce the roles and responsibilities of a Project Safety & Health Coordinator (PSHC) under the WSH Council's "Guidelines on Design for Safety in Buildings and Structures," including for different modes of building procurement (traditional, D&B / PPP) and Design Competitions. The Speaker will also explore job opportunities for Architects as a PSHC and why it is important for Architects in general to embrace the role of PSHC.

Chan Kok Way

Mr. Chan is the Managing Partner of SD Architects. He has more than 30 years work experience as architect. He has been active in SIA Council and other committees including Building Contracts Committee, Membership Committee, ADR Committee, SMAP Committee and Practice Convention Working Group. He is currently the Chairman of the newly formed Workplace Safety & Health Committee.



Dr. Chris Vickery

Dr Vickery has 30 years experience as an architect is Singapore and is currently a director of Architects Team 3 Pte Ltd. He is a graduate of the NUS-KCL M.Sc programme in Construction Law and Arbitration, his dissertation focusing on the position of the architect as a stakeholder in the construction process in relation to the then recently promulgated Workplace Safety & Health Act. Dr Vickery is a member of the SIA Workplace Safety & Health Committee. He is co-author of a handbook on the Workplace Safety & Health Act



Lee Chye Kim Paul

Mr. Lee Chye Kim, Paul is a chartered architect with his own firm "ArchiTechnique Architect", Registered Inspector and Adjudicator. Mr. Lee has been conferred the Bachelor of Architecture, Master of Science (Building Science) and Bachelor of Laws (Hon), University of London. He has assumed the role of an arbitrator, expert witness, mediator and he was consulted on architectural claimed and issues of contractual nature by contractors, sub-contractors and employers on local projects and employed by international contractors for the same for overseas projects. Some projects have a contract value up to \$ 250 million using the international FIDIC form of contracts (both for construction and Design and Build forms).

He is a member of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators, Fellow member of the Singapore Institute of Arbitrators, member of the Royal Institute of British Architects and the Singapore Institute of Architects. Mr. Lee has had the benefit being involved in projects carried out in Indonesia, Australia, China and Sri Lanka and worked in Guam and Middle East (Qatar and UAE, Abu Dhabi).

Darren Benger

Darren has been the Chairman of the SIA Services Procurement Committee since 2007, and is the Deputy Chairman of the SIA WSH Committee.

Darren received his Bachelor of Architecture degree with First Class Honours from the University of Adelaide, Australia in 1995, and registered with the Board of Architects, Singapore in 2001. Since 1996 Darren has resided in Singapore, and he is currently a Director of ATA Architects Pte Ltd.



Aside from his involvement in the WSH and Services Procurement Committees, Darren's involvement in the Singapore Institute of Architects includes election to Council for the 2007/2008, 2008/2009 and 2009/2010 terms, and he has actively participated in the Building Contracts Committee since 2007, the ADR Committee since 2008, the IT Committee in 2005-2006, and the Practice Convention Working Group since 2008.
