### **SYNOPSIS**

Ы О Chinese architecture is closely integrated with literature; The name of the house is both colourful and meaningful. By giving the house a name an otherwise ensemble of building material comes alive. The prime example must be the palace of which the Emperor spends his wedding night. Being the ace of human being, the emperor is the living heaven on earth. The palace that he used for his wedding ceremony is aptly named "The Palace of Fortunate Intercourse"; here the heaven meets the earth in delight, and the yin (negative energy) and the yang (positive energy) dwell in harmony

Architecturally, the function of banner and couplet on the façade of Chinese architecture is similar to the function of pendentive and architerave in Roman architect; they serve to give main entrance it necessary emphasis. Calligraphy is used for decorating the banner and couplet. The writing depicts the name of the house. The name of the house also indicates the function of the building, the character of the occupant, his world, and his ambition.

Talk content as follow:

- •The artist and the architect as one person, citing Chang Lang Ting as example, Ge Yuan as prime examples.
- •The effect of art in architecture. citting Sistine Chaple as example.
- Art, lighting, music and sound as architecture. citing Tun Huang Grotto as example.
- How art affecting the concept of a project, citing Aman-Fa-Yun as example. (basically this the focus of the talk)
- Positing of art work, the do and the dont citing some public sculptures in Spore and US European Public square as example (time square vs ocbc square).

### SPEAKERS PROFILE

Malcolm Koh Ho Ping, born in 1945, is a Registered Architect with 35 years of experience in architectural design, and art consultant in Southeast Asia, Australia, America and China. Holding a B.Arch. Degree from University of Singapore, Mr. Koh is a member of the Royal Institute of British Architects, Singapore Institute of Architects and Malaysia Institute of Architects, and also a free lance painter.

Mr. Koh was trained as an artist at the tender age of 10. He is the only surviving painter in Singapore who has been trained under the strict classical Chinese painting technique, and was trained and given personal tutorage by Master Wu Tze Sheng in the earlier 50's, Master Wu was a refugee at that time. Master Wu was one of the four grand master painters of the Chinese Republican Period. Master Wu was the founder of the first art institute in China; The Suzhou Academy of Art. Mr. Koh was loved and guided by Master Wu for 3 years. The classical technique and the literati philosophy he acquired in his youth have benefited him much in life.

In 1973, Mr. Koh established Project and Design Architects (PADA) in Singapore, and established Xiamen Singa Architecture Design Consultant Co., Ltd. in China in 2003.

Mr. Koh has received many awards and his architectural works can be found in Southeast Asia, Australia, America and many other countries. He was the first architect to work on conservation of historical building in Singapore and also design green architecture, where building and natural elements work together. For some mile stone project; Mr.Koh was the finishes and architecture motif consultant for Petronas Twin Tower in Malaysia collaborated with architect Mr. Cesar Pelli. He was also the stone consultant for Merlion Park in Singapore and K.L International Air Port, where Dr. Kurokawa was the design architect.

The group sculpture "the spice trade" along the Singapore River walk, on the side of Asian Civilization Museum was an open competition won by Mr. Koh, The Spice Trader is a permanent display.

Mr. Koh also practices as art consultant. He has successfully completed The Amanresorts Beijing Summer Palace which is within a UNESCO Cultural heritage area. Currently Mr. Koh is working on The Amanresorts Hangzhou.
