Ms. Lim Yinshi was born and schooled in Singapore, graduating from National University of Singapore with Master of Architecture in 2000. Working directly with Mr. Sonny Chan, she has overseen projects both local and in the region, developing a keen interest in residential interiors and architecture. Projects involve include good class bungalows in Singapore, proposals for bungalow and cluster housing developments in Kuala Lumpur, Bali and condominiums developments in Surabaya.

Judges' Citation - Park Seven

This is a high-rise residential building in an established urban setting in central KL. The work uses materials which were mostly locally-sourced and were expressed in their natural states as much as possible. The architect has taken careful steps to minimise the use of mechanical ventilation and artificial lighting by allowing natural ventilation in all the common areas through efficacious architectural and structural integration. Residents can enjoy the green environment which covers 80% of the site, providing the residents with a relaxing environment in the middle of the city. The jury highly commends the architect for providing a high degree of comfort for the residents while minimising energy usage at the same time. The Jury also noted that the plan is well resolved and the building sits excellently within its context.



CPD PROGRAMME

Mr. Chan Sau Yan, Sonny completed his education in Malaysia and United Kingdom, graduating as an architect in 1963 at the Northern Polytechnic of London, and did post graduate Tropical studies at the Architectural Association School in 1964.

His experience encompasses a wide range of residential, commercial, institutional, recreational and tourism related projects in the region as well as internationally. His extensive experience in resort and city hotels span over more than 40 years working with international chain operators such as Hyatt, Sheraton, IHG, Mandarin Oriental, Hard Rock Hotel, Hilton and independent operators.

Mr. Ko Shiou Hee is a Principal Director of K2LD Architects Pte Ltd both in Singapore and Melbourne, Australia. Shiou Hee has extensive experience in the architecture of residential, public institutional buildings and commercial projects. His works are highly recognized with many winning awards and featured articles in both Singapore and International architectural journals.

Judges' Citation - Wind Catcher House (Bunga Tembusu)

The Jury find this an interesting and unusual design - in particular, the recycling of materials in its architecture. A diseased tree on the site was recycled as building material. The recycled timber panels are used in the foreground with trees in the background, creating an illusion that the volume is transparent. The Jury were impressed with the architect's effort towards sustainability. Besides using wood from the diseased trees, timber from another old house was reused as flooring and in an art installation

Mr. Robin Tan graduated with a Bachelor of Architecture (Honours) in 1995 from the National University of Singapore. He is presently Principal Architect of Wallflower Architecture + Design, a practice known for its innovative and contemporary architecture and interior design. Wallflowers works are featured in numerous regional and international publications and was exhibited in 'SINGAPORE SEASON IN LONDON 2005', an event named 'Singapore Evening - SingaporEdge'. Wallflower's award-winning architecture and interior design projects are Enclosed Open House, Water-Cooled House, Balaclava, Loang & Noi, Snails & Spa Esprit.

Judges' Citation - Enclosed Open House

This work is an Asian-inspired design - borrowing from classical Chinese courtyard house typology. To overcome the limitation of being sited in the middle of a densely populated estate with no views, the architect has created 5 courtyarc which ventilate and provide views and privacy for the residents. The Jury were impressed with the layout and the architecture which gives a quiet, calm and stately feel to the house.

One of Singapore's leading architects, Randy Chan's architectural and design experience includes work on projects as diverse as stage design, private housing, cluster-housing and master-planning - all of which are guided by the simple philosophy that architecture and the aesthetics are part of the same impulse. Randy takes a multidisciplinary architectural approach to his projects and specializes in the convergence between Art and Architecture. He is the proud recipient of the SIA Façade

Judges' Citation - 38 Holland Park

The Jury found this work remarkable - the cohesive design ties up the entire concept. It is an open yet at the same time closed design. The architect interprets the humble but tropically-relevant balcony design to create a cohesive expression of the design concept. This work has skilfully transformed the concept into the existing form. It presents clarity and consistency in its execution. This is an unusual solution for a house with a courtyard in which the work is a striking urban form derived from a cube. This resulted in every cube in the house connecting with the next cube, giving it a new sense of life. The Jury found the work to be spatially beautiful and maturity in the handling of form and materials.
