SYNOPSIS

The design component in current projects is increasingly complex and intertwined. The leader in a design team would be faced with the challenges concerning integration of design. In the event of a design flaw, a developer would seek recourse from the consultant at fault. Primarily, the service engagement contract would define the allocation of responsibility in the light of common law principles.

The speaker has chosen a UK case to illustrate the respective the legal positions of the consultants which had pit an M&E engineer against an architect who assumed the role a lead design consultant. A developer had successfully sued the M&E engineer for a design failure whereby a cold draught was found in a shopping complex during the winter months that was attributable to a pair of automatic doors. The M&E engineer settled the matter with the developer without admission of liability and sought a contribution from the architect.

This case study will take you through the various stages of design development and implementation including the variation from revolving doors to the automatic doors. At the end of the seminar, those attending would have the opportunity of learning about the importance of: (a) the service engagement contract; (b) being aware of the relevant standards in design and the need to integrate the design; and (c) expert evidence. All those who choose not to attend would be gently reminded that while ignorance might truly be bliss, it is also no defence to a legal claim against you.

Outside the university, he is a Deputy President of the Singapore Strata Titles Board.

He is also a General Editor of the Asian International Arbitration Journal and a member of the Editorial Advisory Board and Correspondent of the International Construction Law Review.



In the quest to disseminate knowledge, Dr Chan has delivered more than 200 conference/seminar papers and conducted numerous in-house training programs on matters pertaining to standard form contracts and other areas of construction law and dispute resolution including arbitration.
