





Synopsis

Designed by Boston-based, internationally renowned architect Moshe Safdie for the Las Vegas Sands Corporation, the 929,000 square meter (10 million square-foot) urban district anchors the Singapore waterfront, creates a gateway to Singapore, and provides a dynamic setting for a vibrant public life.

The district includes three hotel towers connected 57 stories in the air with a first-of-its-kind Sands Skypark, The Sands Expo and Convention Center with a capacity to host 11,000 people, the atrium-style Sands Casino with multiple floor gaming and entertainment, two Broadway theaters with a total capacity for 4,000 visitors, an iconic museum anchoring the promontory for Marina Bay and two glass and steel framed island buildings known at the Crystal Pavilions housing world-class retail and night clubs.

All of the above is woven together on 4 levels by the connective street-style Shoppes at Marina Bay Sands that includes over 300 retail outlets in 75,000 square meters of premium retail space that opens out onto an 800 meter long public promenade fronting Marina Bay designed by the renowned landscape architect, Peter Walker of California.

The tour will include an introduction to the design of each of these facilities with emphasis on the both the engineering of this amazing structure and the way in which distinct architectural statements work together to form the greater Integrated Resort.


