#### **SYNOPSIS**


Construction professionals owe contractual duties to their clients to exercise reasonable skill and care when performing their duties. However, they are also liable in tort not just to their clients, but also to third parties who may suffer damage as a result of their actions or negligence. This seminar addresses the topic of professional negligence claims from both the legal and practical perspectives. The speaker will identify the legal duties of construction professionals and the standard of care which is required of them. The speaker will also discuss some of the key issues which construction professionals ought to be concerned with, whether they are asserting or defending their rights in a potential professional negligence claim. The seminar will conclude with an overview of some of the more common dispute resolution options, with a particular emphasis on arbitration.

- (i) What is professional negligence and who in the construction industry needs to be concerned about it?
- (ii) What are the duties of a construction professional?
- (iii) What is the standard of care required of a construction professional?
- (iv) What is the extent of damages which could potentially result from professional negligence?
- (v) Examples of professional negligence in the construction industry.
- (vi) Dispute resolution options: arbitration in particular.
