The Code on Accessibility in the Built Environment provides the acceptable solutions to satisfy the performance requirement under the Building Control Regulations to create an accessible built environment. How much do you know of the Code and its intent. Have you ever wonder if the Code is over-prescriptive and the authority is over stringent in administering it.

The presenter will share with you some of the common errors and non compliances found during TOP inspections. She will show how some deviations, no matter how minor, can give rise to concerns with safety and usability of the features intended for the users.

Ms Goh Siam Imm is the Deputy Director of Building Plan & Universal Design Department (BPUD) of the Building and Construction Authority (BCA) which administers the Building Control Act and its regulations. In addition to her regulatory role, she also promotes Universal Design in the Built Environment.

She is currently chairing the multi-agency Committee to review the current Code on Accessibility in the Built Environment, 2007 which was published in 2007 after review by the previous committee chaired by her.

Ms Goh has a BA in Architecture, MSc in Fire Safety Engineering and a Diploma in Community Services Disability Work.

Highlights & Case Studies of Green Mark Version 4


Synopsis:

Since the Green Mark Scheme was established in Singapore in 2005, there has been continuous research done to improve and perfect it. In 2011, the Green Mark Version 4 was introduced. This presentation highlights the addition and changes from the previous versions and will also discuss on the case studies whereby the Green Mark Version 4 has been implemented with minimum cost implication.

A discussion on legal issues in BIM implementation

Synopsis:

The presentation will discuss the possible legal issues affecting parties which may arise in the implementation of BIM and possible legal solutions.

Profile:

Paul Wong is a partner in Rodyk & Davidson LLP's Litigation & Arbitration Practice Group.

Paul was admitted to the Bar of Singapore in 1992 and to the Bar of Malaysia in 1998.

Paul's practice includes construction, banking and insolvency, and general commercial litigation. He has acted as counsel in numerous construction disputes, both in arbitration and litigation, with a specific emphasis on engineering related issues. Notably, he was one of the counsel acting for the main contractor of Circle Line Contract C824, the main potential defendant in the inquiry into the collapse of Singapore's Nicoll Highway on 20 April 2004.

His clients include developers, quantity surveyors, architects, contractors and sub-contractors. Apart from dispute resolution, Paul advises his clients in the drafting of construction related transactions, including numerous forms of construction contracts. He has acted for main contractors in major infrastructure projects in Singapore both in an advisory role and also as counsel. Construction related cases Paul has worked on include the MRT Circle Line contracts, the Deep Tunnel Sewerage System contracts, the Marina Barrage contracts and Marina South District Cooling Plant contracts. Paul has also acted as Singapore law counsel for PPP projects in Singapore including the SMU Hostels project, the MOE Schools project, the NUS University Town project, Changi NEWater project and the Sports Hub project.

Paul's banking and insolvency experience includes recovery work with specific emphasis on facilities secured by land and guarantees, advising liquidators and receivers, and bankruptcy and liquidation cases. Paul has acted in shareholder disputes, insurance claims (general including all risks policies and professional indemnity), employee-employer disputes (including wrongful dismissal cases), employee fraud cases, international contract claims and sale of goods claims.

Paul is a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators and the Singapore Institute of Arbitrators and a Member of the Malaysian of the Malaysian Institute of Arbitrators.
