(1) Presentation by the Winning Architect**(2) Topic: Designing Hawker Centre for Comfort**

Speaker: Prof. Wong Nyuk Hien, Department of Building, School of Design and Environment, National University of Singapore

Synopsis:

Hawker centres, located conveniently in almost all housing estates, industrial estates and the Central Business District (CBD), have provided Singaporeans with economical meals and they are also the places where many of the nation's famous food could be found. These hawker centres have also gone through a series of upgrading programs launched by NEA to improve the condition. As most of these hawker centres are naturally ventilated, one critical aspect of the upgrading is to ensure that the hawker centres are well ventilated to enhance the comfort for the users. This presentation will discuss the crucial findings of a research project by NUS to study the natural ventilation performance of hawker centres and highlight the critical factors to be considered in the design of the hawker centres to ensure good ventilation.

Brief CV:

Professor Wong Nyuk Hien is professor in the Department of Building, National University of Singapore. Currently he is the Programme Director for B.Sc (Project and Facilities Management). He is also the Research Thrust Leader for Planning and Design, NUS-JTC Industrial Infrastructure Innovation (I³) Centre and the Research Group Leader for the Centre for Sustainable Asian Cities (CSAC). He has been the Principal Investigator for a number of research projects funded by the various Singapore government agencies to study the natural ventilation performance of hawker centres, public housing and the Zero Energy Building of BCA. At the urban level, Prof Wong has also worked on a number of projects to study the Urban Heat Island effect in Singapore and to explore the various mitigation measures such as the effective utilization of urban greenery and cool roof materials. Over the years, he has researched on how greenery can be effectively integrated with building facades through the incorporation of rooftop gardens and vertical greenery systems to reduce the heat gain into the buildings and also to reduce the urban heat. He is currently working on an island wide Urban Climatic Mapping study commissioned by the Urban Redevelopment Authority of Singapore. Dr. Wong has been engaged as member of the advisory boards to the various government agencies in Singapore. He is currently the chair of the Green Mark Sub-committee on ventilation simulation. Prof Wong has written 7 books and published more than 400 international referred journal and conference papers in these related fields.

(3) Topic: Making Kindness Our Business

Speaker: Dr William Wan - General Secretary of the Singapore Kindness Movement and the World Kindness Movement.
