

**SIA Professional Knowledge Series:** 

# Design Safety, Specification and the Architecture Ironmongery Connection

Architectural Ironmongery often seems straightforward, accounting for a small percentage of total construction costs. It can consequently be overlooked in the design process. As experienced specifiers will know however, the wrong product selection can result in a disproportionate amount of problems during project completion, building compliance issues, and high maintenance costs for end-users.

As the primary point of contact between the building and its users, the ironmongery is integral to how a building operates and is a critical element of the design in important areas such as life safety and accessibility. In addition, correct specification can help achieve a welcome balance between the sometimes competing demands of form vs. function, safety vs. security and durability vs. value.

A wide range of National and International Standards exist for various product categories including hinges, locksets and door controls to assist specifiers in product specification and quality control. In the absence of a unified international standard however, much of the information can seem confusing.

This seminar will provide Architects and Specifiers with valuable insights into the essential features of European Standards (EN) and American National Standards Institute (ANSI) Standards, explain the similarities and key differences between the two, and discuss how the ironmongery specified can help make a building safe, accessible and compliant.
