

A review of recent legal development affecting the impact of the SIA Architect's status

Dr Philip Chan, an Associate Professor, had received training and practised in the area of quantity surveying in the 70s and 80s. Special provisions that will make the SIA contract useful for use internationally will be brought to the participants' attention.
