In addition of project work, Chee Huang heads DPA's designGROUP, focusing on enhancing design competency office-wide. He is also championing various CSR efforts of the firm such as the Concept Bus Shelter in Jurong, Elder Care Centre in Marine Terrace and NDP 2016 Set Design.

Chee Huang is also currently the 1st Vice President of Singapore Institute of Architects (SIA). He currently helms the Education Thrust of the Institute.

An enthusiast in the academic realm, Chee Huang has been an adjunct design tutor for the third year Bachelor of Architecture design studios, in the Department of Architecture, NUS since 2006.

The Enabling Village is a demonstration of heartland rejuvenation through adaptive reuse of the old Bukit Merah Vocational Institute / Employment & Employability Institute (e2i) in Redhill. The site was previously fenced-in, inward-looking and did not contribute to the neighbourhood. The Masterplan conceives the Village as a new community heart and opens up the space as a park to connect people with disabilities, residents and public.

The design removes all physical barriers, extends linkages and creates a variety of shared spaces, gardens and amenities, breathing life between and within buildings. A simple robust palette of finishes and motifs was adopted as a kit-of-parts system to stitch together surfaces and spaces of the new and existing.

The design scope includes architecture, interior design, signage, lighting, art and landscaping to deliver a holistically integrated environment. The porous and accessible nature of the Enabling Village creates an inclusive environment, integrating people with disabilities as equal in the community.

Goodlife! Makan is an innovative social initiative created by Montfort Care, a voluntary welfare organisation, to support ageing-in-place, built around meaningful pastimes that address the physical and mental wellness of seniors. This cheerfully designed 360sqm recreational centre is situated at the void deck of a HDB block in Marine Parade, with a communal kitchen as its nucleus. The place aims largely at reconnecting stay-alone elderly to the wider community to facilitate multi-generational exchanges. With cooking and dining together as the essence of the experience, this activity space provides opportunities for senior residents to interact and socialise through Singapore's rich and easily understood food culture, while developing roles and responsibilities from the rituals of food preparation and consumption. The facility reinterprets social settings for the elderly, as a pioneering and alternative model that is inclusive and cost-efficient to create and maintain across open neighbourhoods.
